Situation Report No. 5 (30th July 2010) of Monsoon Rains / Floods in AJ&K

Situation:

The State of Azad Jammu & Kashmir is under the wave of constant heavy rains for last couple of days. This monsoon spell has caused raise in water level in Neelum and Jehlum rivers. It has also caused landslides in some areas which blocked the roads at some places but DDMA was able to clear the roads on immediate basis. A high level flood in Neelum River has passed through Muzaffarabad city yesterday night at 2230 hrs.

Today early in the morning, a breach in the Zilzal Lake occurred which resulted a notable raise in the water level of river Jehlum.

Details of Losses:

State Disaster Management Authority has already warned all the Deputy Commissioners about this spell of monsoon rains and the information gathered so far is as given below:

- 550 Families affected in Muzaffarabad City
- 2 Hydel Power Stations of Pak Army in Neelum Valley were washed away by the flood
- 10 Spans of High Transmission Electricity Line at Lower Plate, Muzaffarabad fully destroyed.
- 1 Police Station, Lawat, Neelum partially damaged.
- 1 Pick-up got drowned into the river in Taali Mandi, Muzaffarabad
- 1 Police Check Post at Gari Habibullah partially damaged.
- Road Linking Gari Habibullah with Muzaffarabad got cut off due to erosion.
- 1 Bally Bridge was completely destroyed at Kalla Kot, Neelum Valley
- 1 Bridge linking Sharda with Khari Gam was partially damaged in District Neelum
- 1 Foot Bridge at Surgan Nalla fully destroyed.
- 1 Bridge and 1 Furniture Factory in Nallah Nareen, Neelum fully destroyed.
- Pakistan Army's Commanding Officer's Office at Thejjan fully destroyed.
- Timber of AKLASC and Forest Department was also washed away in District Neelum
- Trees and crops/lands have also been reported to have got submerged into the water.
- The livelihoods of the population living along Neelum River have severely got affected.
- 110 Shops were fully destroyed due to flood in Nullah Mahal, District Bagh.
- 10 Crush Machines were completely washed away in District Bagh.
- 1 Poultry Shed was completely burnt by short circuit in District Rawalakot.
- Machinery of chinese Neelum Jhelum Hydel project has been partially damaged due to "Agar Nullah", Kullian, Chjhattar Klass, Muzaffarabad.

Response by SDMA, DDMA and Civil Defence so far:

- The flood situation is actively being monitored by SDMA and DDMA's at all levels.
- Two teams of State Disaster Management Authority visited various locations of district Muzaffarabad including Bela Makri, Taali Mandi, Lower Plate and Shoukat Line Bridge.
- A team consisting of 25 volunteers has been put on standby by SDMA for early response.
- Around 350 families of affected areas were relocated to Jinnah Pilot High School No. 2 building, TB Hospital, Forest Office Building and 200 families were relocated to their relatives residing at safer places.
- Cooked food together with NFIs has been provided to them last night.
- SDMA and DDMA have given early warnings to the population through loud speakers and announcements in the Masaajid (Mosques) regarding the flood situation.
- All Deputy Commissioners have been informed to cope with the situation.
- Food provided to 550 families for next three days, started from yesterday.
